Regional Director – Help Wanted

Delaware Interface Power & Light (DeIPL) is hiring a regional director with a focus on Sussex and Kent counties. With an emphasis on Environmental Justice, this motivated leader will help houses of worship, their congregants and neighbors save energy, money reduce greenhouse gas pollution and join our growing Climate Army to advocate for a livable planet.

This position reports to the Board President and is responsible to collaborate with the Executive Director to ensure consistent achievement of its mission, vision, and strategic goals with the following duties:

- Responsible for the planning, implementation, tracking, and reporting of designated programs, such as [Faith Efficiencies](#) and [Climate Conversations](#) for all of Delaware.
- Responsible for implementation of Sacred Grounds program in DeIPL's southern region of Kent and Sussex Counties
- Work with and take direction from DeIPL Executive Director, focusing Sussex and Kent Counties Region to expand and support faith community membership
- Partner with and support the Board of Director functional committees, such as Finance, Advocacy, Membership & Outreach
- Support advocacy efforts, as identified by the board
- Assist the board on grant-seeking and fundraising efforts

The Regional Director will be expected to cultivate and maintain relationships with a diversity of faith communities, stakeholders, and policymakers, including other non-governmental organizations, local, and state government officials, faith leaders, community leaders, and other potential partners. As there is no physical office, the Regional Director will be required to provide their own phone and office space.

Desired Qualifications:

- Active commitment to the organization's mission
- Successful fundraising experience
- Experience with non-profit boards, climate change/environmental/energy issues, fundraising, project management, and advocacy are desirable.
- Strong oral, written and interpersonal communication skills.

Hours & Compensation: This position will start at 20 hours/week. Salary range for the part-time position is experience dependent. Bonus may be paid for successful aspirational fundraising.

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
